

STOLEN MANDOLINS

\$1,000 REWARD!



Please help. My house in Tijeras, NM (near Albuquerque) was broken into on Oct. 14 and both my mandolins were stolen. These are unique, high value instruments.

Monteleone Grand Artist mandolin No. 63 (pictured on right), says "Monteleone" on the peghead and "Grand Artist" is inscribed on the tailpiece. Heavy wear on top on scroll and lower bout. The finish is partially worn down to bare wood in these areas. Most of the finish is worn off the back of the neck. Label inside signed "John Monteleone" and serial number "63" written in blue ink (look inside the lower f-hole). Was in a green "Pegasus" fiberglass case with green velvet lining.

John Sullivan custom F-5 mandolin (on left). No name on the peghead, but "Sullivan" is stamped on the truss rod cover (ebony wood piece at bottom of peghead). Bare wood on back of neck. It is signed in pencil on the inside "John Sullivan 2005" (look inside the lower f-hole). Was in a cream colored "Pegasus" fiberglass case with green velvet lining.
